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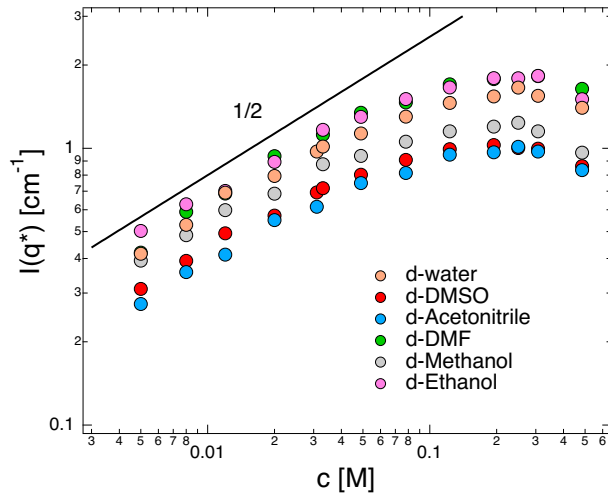

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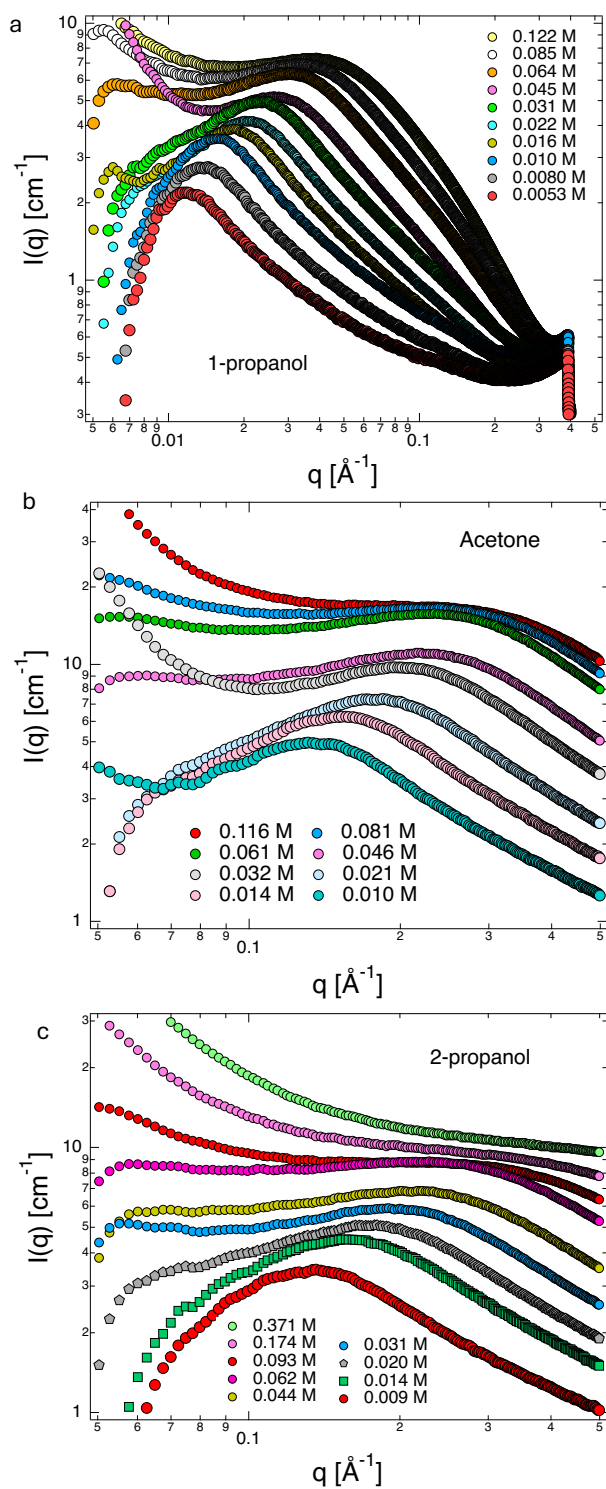


FIG. S2. SAXS profiles for TBAPSS in three low dielectric constant solvents at selected concentrations indicated on the legend.
